Kindergarten Registration Information

Any child who is five (5) years old on or before September 30, 2024, is eligible to enroll in kindergarten in the Southwest Local School District for the 2024-2025 school year. Registration details are listed below. If you have any questions about kindergarten registration, please contact Lisa Williams at district office (513-728-8401).

- To begin the registration process, go to southwestschools.org, click on **New Student Registration**, and then click on **Kindergarten Registration**.
- A copy of the birth certificate, proof of residency, photo id for parent/guardian and any court/custody documents are all required for enrollment.
- You will also need to complete the Ohio Health History Forms.
- When you have completed the online registration, contact the District Registrar Lisa Williams at District Office (513) 728-8401 to make sure the documents have been received and are acceptable to complete your registration.
