## Graduation Requirements For the Class of 2018 & Beyond

## 18 Points on End of Course Tests, or 12 Points on the Work Keys Test (Career Center Based), or A Non-Remediation Score on the ACT or SAT

21 Carnegie Unit Credits

18 Points on 7 End of Course State Tests (Class of 2018 and beyond)

For each of the seven end-of-course state tests, a student earns one to five graduation points. Students have the potential to earn a total of 35 points. To meet this graduation option, a student must earn a minimum number of 18 points from the seven tests.

This graduation option gives a student flexibility in accumulating 18 points. A high score on one test can balance a low score on another test. A student must earn a total of at least four points on English tests, four points on math tests and six points on science and social studies tests.

All End of Course Testing Courses are scheduled for grades 8, 9 and 10. A two-year recovery period is available for all students to retake tests to improve scores in December, April and June.

Test retakes are scheduled each year in December, April and June. Students are encouraged to focus on two tests at a time and remediation is offered at two levels during the 2016-17 school year.

Level One Remediation – Meets every Friday, during Advisory Period in assigned rooms (9:33 – 10:13)

**Level Two Remediation** – Meeting every day from October – test dates in December. Guidance Counselors will meet with students and make changes from study hall or electives to a Remediation class.

Remediation will consist of an on-line program specifically designed for the End of Course Test. The program is "Study Island" and the monitor for the program will be Shelly Miller.

Tuesdays – A teacher from the Math Department will assist on Tuesday, providing live class instruction. Thursday – A teacher from the ELA Department will assist on Thursday, providing live class instruction.
